This picture is of Atten's Landing on March 6. On February 27, the Pecatonica River was 11.5 feet deep. That figure is considered a minor flood stage. The river is now at 12.98 feet. Our river more often floods in February, March, and April, followed by July and September.

In the past, the two fastest-growing paddling segments were fishing and women. You can think of this division as two distinct areas. Fishing kayaks often are very extensively outfitted and have several magazines devoted to their activities.

A male paddler might have an initial advantage in upper body strength. Women analyze the problem. A recent article on kayak slalom racing shows women having faster runs than men. For us, the objective is to be out enjoying nature and family. Check the paddling instruction websites for more information.
